Sailing Ship Wind Chimes

Instructions No. 2021

Difficulty: Advanced

Working time: 2 Hours

Ahoy, ship ahead. Our sailboat is slightly copied and makes a good impression with the decorations of shells and bars. It will be a highlight in your garden or on your balcony and plays a beautiful sound game with every gust of wind.



This is how you make the sailing ship wind chime:

First loosen the knots on the sails and remove the sails **for** easier painting and gluing. Now draw with a Marker different thick lines in blue on one sail, so that it gets stripes

On the other sail a **Napkin** with **Napkin varnish** for textiles. To do this, first loosen the top printed layer of your napkin motif and place Napkin varnish, it on Napkin. the desired spot

After drying, both sails are ironed inside out and are washable at 30°C due to the fixation

Jute cord is tied around the lower part of the sail trunk and fixed with Handicraft glue it

Then, eyelets are screwed **into** the mast at the top and into the boat below the bottom. For hanging up you can now attach a jute cord to the eyelet at the top of the mast

With a 0.3 mm twist drill (for screwdriver or Proxxon) holes are drilled into any different shells and bell cups for hanging. If required, the Bell Cups can be

equipped with VBS Handicraft paint be painted. The **bars** are knotted to the eyelets of the sailboat with a perlon thread. Then the shells and bell cups are provided with the perlon thread and knotted to the eyelets.
